For the **"Research"** dimension of the "Climate Walk" project, we are looking for dedicated Co-Wanderer-to-be who can imagine contributing **5-10 hours a week to research-related activities**. Depending on personal interest and disciplinary background, these activities can include: critical examination of the environmental and climate policy situation in the countries along the route, the creation of interview guidelines and questionnaires in different languages, the evaluation and analysis of collected data material and the presentation and publication of the results.

What do we offer:

- Exciting, varied and meaningful work in an interdisciplinary team
- Free time management and flexibility in collaboration
- Opportunity to contribute your own interests and focal points to the research project and permission to use the jointly collected data for your own bachelor's/master's/doctoral thesis
- The prospect of long-term collaboration in the project, which – if we manage to raise the necessary financial resources – can also be compensated in the future
- Confirmation of whether you are working in a legally recognized non-profit association (e.g. in the form of receipt of an internship confirmation or a job reference)

Requirement/qualification profile:

- Well advanced or ideally completed bachelor's and/or master's degree in subjects such as cultural and social anthropology, sociology, political science, (human) geography, biology/ecology, environmental management and other relevant fields of study at the interface of social and natural sciences
- Prior knowledge on the topics of "climate change", "social-ecological crisis" etc.; ideally: written bachelor's and/or master's thesis on such topics
- Experience in designing and applying qualitative and/or quantitative (social science-oriented) research methods
- Experience working in interdisciplinary teams
- Experience in finding, reading and analyzing policy papers, scientific studies and environmental/climate relevant legal texts
- Experience in writing scientific papers; ideally: first own publication experience and experience in editing texts
- Long-term commitment and interest from June 2022 to hiking a bit yourself if possible

Areas of responsibility (depending on interests and division within the team):

- Design of interview guides and questionnaires on the subject of "Experiences/perceptions of the climate crisis in Europe" Collection of empirical data using qualitative and quantitative methods of social research Evaluation of interviews, questionnaires and observations
- Independent research regarding the socio-ecological, climate and environmental policy situation in selected countries along the route as well as regarding exciting literature
- (if of interest): Discourse analysis of the way in which climate change is talked about and dealt with in certain European countries
- (in the case of special language/regional knowledge): contact person and coordinator for research activities in the respective country
- Development of scientifically sound and appealing content for external communication Participation in the creation of scientific publications and other text formats
